We regulate the practice of physical therapy in Louisiana by only licensing individuals who minimally qualify to practice physical therapy and responding to complaints regarding the conduct of the individuals who hold a privilege to practice or are licensed by our board. We do this for the citizens of Louisiana, so that recipients of physical therapy care have the opportunity to improve their health in a safe environment.





Complaint 2022-I-006/009|Cody R. Leblanc, PT 08870R|Practice Issues| LeBlanc committed violations including improper delegation, fraudulent billing, unprofessional conduct related to inter-office relationships, and inadequate documentation. His license is suspended for three years with a required Fitness for Duty and Psychosocial Evaluation by a Board-recognized provider, the live 3-day PBI Professional Boundaries and Ethics Course (Essential Edition) and the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) documentation course. At the conclusion of the three-year suspension period, the respondent will be on probation for two (2) years. During the probationary period, the Board may make random unannounced monitoring visits to Respondent's work site.

Complaint 2023-I-018|Ashley A. Phillips, PT 07848|Substance Abuse| Phillips self-reported a May 23, 2023, DWI conviction from an August 8, 2021, arrest, which was not disclosed during license renewal. Treatment records revealed nine relapses between November 2021 and August 2023. Her license is suspended until successful completion of a fitness-for-duty evaluation. Upon clearance, her license will be on probation for five years, requiring compliance with treatment recommendations and participation in the Recovering Physical Therapy Program.

Complaint 2023-I-060|Donna B. Redmon, PTA A7007|Renewal| Redmon failed to renew her license in 2020 and 2022 and continued to practice with an expired license. Prior to reinstatement, she completed 60 hours of board-approved continuing education and met all reinstatement requirements. Upon reinstatement, her license was placed on probation for a minimum of two years.

Complaint 2023-I-036|Roderick R. Smith, PTA A4816| Criminal Conviction| Smith failed to maintain adequate treatment records and improperly treated patients without necessary reassessments. Smith also failed to disclose arrests and convictions (2001, 2008, 2018, 2022). He voluntarily surrendered his license, which has the effect of a revocation. He will be eligible to apply for reinstatement after five years, pending a fitness-for-duty evaluation. A hearing will determine his eligibility to return to practice, with possible requirements for remedial education and monitoring.

Complaint 2023-I-056|Latisha L. Williams, PT 09078R|Supervision| Williams failed to supervise appropriately, maintain records, reassess patients, or hold required patient care conferences. Her license is on probation for a minimum of two years, during which she will undergo random monitoring, complete specified ethics and documentation courses, and attend live jurisprudence sessions during renewal periods.

Complaint 2024-I-004|Jeffery R. Reeves, PT 08293R|Substance Abuse| A complaint revealed Reeves consumed alcohol during work hours as Clinical Director. An inpatient evaluation recommended substance use treatment. Reeves voluntarily surrendered his license, which has the effect of revocation. He will be eligible to reinstate in five years after completing a fitness-for-duty evaluation and following recommendations. A hearing will determine his eligibility for re-licensure.

Complaint 2022-I-013|Angela C. Brewer, PTA A8915R|Substance Abuse| In April 2024, Brewer participated in a random drug screen as a Participant in the Recovering Physical Therapy Program. She tested positive for alcohol, which violated her prior agreement with the Board and her license was summarily suspended. In May 2024, the board suspended her license until she completed a relapse-prevention program and received a report from a board-recognized provider stating that she is safe to return to the practice of physical therapy with reasonable skill and safety to the public. Upon reinstatement, her license was placed on probation for five-years, which includes participating in the Recovering Physical Therapy Program.

Complaint 2023-I-035|Adam N. Casborn, Jr., PTA A7495|CEU| The Continuing Education Audit for the 2023 Renewal Period resulted in a finding that Casborn was non-compliant with continuing education requirements, resulting in a reprimand. He is subject to two subsequent renewal period CEU audits.

Complaint 2023-I-048|Elizabeth A. Haile, PTA A10789|Substance Abuse| Haile was arrested for a DUI in September 2023 and failed to report the arrest in a timely manner. Her license was suspended until she completed a fitness-for-duty evaluation. Following her suspension period, her license was placed on probation for five years with required participation in the Recovering Physical Therapy Program.

Complaint 2024-I-005|Jamie R. Floyd, PT 01920|Substance Abuse| Floyd failed to report an August 11, 2023 arrest on her 2024 renewal application. The board suspended her license until she successfully completed all treatment recommendations following a fitness-forduty evaluation. Following her suspension, her license was placed on probation for five years, requiring compliance with treatment recommendations and participation in the Recovering Physical Therapy Program.

Complaint 2023-I-009|Russell W. Hearne, PT 09007R|Practice Issues| Hearne did not document the transfer of care or complete a discharge summary for patients he was assigned to from February 20, 2023 through February 24, 2023. His license is placed on probation for a minimum period of one year during which time he shall comply with random monitoring visits. Within the first six months of probation, he must complete PBI Education Medical Record Keeping Course.

Complaint 2023-I-057|Daniel J. Allemond, PTA A8327|Boundaries| Allemond engaged in unprofessional conduct related to inappropriate workplace communications with co-workers and co-professionals. Allemond's license is on probation for one year during which time he is required to complete individual psychotherapy with a Board-recognized provider. He is subject to monitoring visits and must present his consent order to his employer, direct supervisor, and any physical therapists, physical therapist assistants, or technicians he supervise or works for. He must also complete the PBI Education Professional Boundaries Course within the first 6 months of his probationary period.

Complaint 2024-I-015|Ryan S. Neill, PT 10956|Practice Issues| Neill failed to report to the Board behavior of a co-professional related to unprofessional conduct associated with alcohol consumption at the workplace. Neill's license was reprimanded and he is required to complete additional continuing education related to disclosure and duty to report.

Complaint 2024-I-012|Lauren R. Luke, PT 07854|Failure to Renew| Practiced with an expired license from May 1, 2024, to June 5, 2024. She must also complete the HPSO PT Spotlight Course: Liability for Business Owners and Supervisors.

Complaint 2024-I-016|Hubert C. Ashley, Jr., PT 07961|Failure to Renew| Practiced with an expired license from May 1, 2024, to July 10, 2024.

Complaint 2024-I-018|Steven C. Gosselin, PT 08890R|Failure to Renew| Practiced with an expired license from May 1, 2024, to July 10, 2024.

Complaint 2024-I-017|Edward T. Reynolds, PT 11541|Failure to Renew| Practiced with an expired license from May 1, 2024, to July 10, 2024.

Complaint 2024-I-019|Mary C. Shanks, PT 00183|Failure to Renew| Practiced with an expired license from May 1, 2024, to July 10, 2024.

Recommendations

R.S. La 37:2405A(9)a.: Reporting annually to the governor and to the presiding officer of each house of the legislature on the condition of the practice of physical therapy in the state, making recommendations for improvement of the practice of physical therapy or the operation of the board, and submitting a record of the proceedings of the board during the year, together with the names of all physical therapists and physical therapist assistants to whom the board issued licenses during the year.

As reported in 2023, the board engaged stakeholders to provide feedback on improvements in the operations of the board and improvements to the regulation of the practice of physical therapy. The board members worked with legislators to improve the law, as it currently exists, and unfortunately the legislation did not successfully pass through the legislature in 2024. The Practice Act Committee of the Board spent the remainder of 2024 reviewing the Louisiana Administrative Code Title 46 Subsections 103-501 to determine if there are any Rules that are unnecessary or inconsistent with the law and agency's mission, and to determine whether the probably benefits of the Rule outweigh the burdens and costs on persons regulated by the rule.

The Committee determined that all rules are consistent with law and the agency's mission. Some rules; however, were identified to be redundant in law, which called into question the necessity of the redundant rules as they were simply a repeat of language in the law. There was discussion at the Committee level as to whether the removal of the redundant Rule would be problematic or not. At this time there is not a firm determination by the Board as to whether or not redundant Rules are unnecessary are not.

Due to high turnover of Board Members in 2024, the Rules identified at the committee level for potential removal or amendment were not formally brought forth to the full Board for review. The current plan is to review the Committee's recommendations at a Board Retreat in 2025 for a lengthy and detailed discussion regarding the burdens and costs on persons regulated by the rule.

Once the Board reviews the recommendations and makes a determination on each Rule identified, the plan of action is to hold a public hearing, which will be noticed in the State Register. Following the public hearing, the Board plans to submit the proposed Rule changes to the Louisiana Department of Justice through their Occupational Licensing Review Program (OLRP) for review prior to publishing a Rule change request in the State Register.

In the Board's 2025 Governor's report, which will be issued in 2026, the Louisiana Physical Therapy Board plans to document the list of Rule changes that occurred in 2025 that improve the practice of physical therapy or the operation of the board.

Practitioners in Louisiana

License Renewals

The key objective in licensing is to only license individuals who are qualified to practice physical therapy, per statute and rule, while identifying and eliminating unnecessary barriers to entry for qualified individuals. The key activities performed include receiving information for initial license, reinstatement, and renewal applications. For all applicants initially applying for a license in Louisiana, an FBI background check is performed. The board maintains a database or licensees and displays license information on a website for public access.

2024 Compact Privileges

In 2018, the PT Licensure Compact was established through the legislature to improve portability in the physical therapy profession. On July 22, 2019, Louisiana became an active member state issuing privileges to individuals who wish to practice in Louisiana through a Compact Privilege, rather than obtaining a license. Below is a chart to show how many Compact privileges were purchased in 2024.

Accomplishment Roundup

Announcement of First Educational Conference

In 2024, the Board began preparations for a Educational Conference for licensees, scheduled for 2025. Offered at no cost to Louisiana-licensed PTs and PTAs, this event is designed to give back to the profession by providing critical insights into complex healthcare regulations that impact daily practice.

In collaboration with subject matter experts and legislators, the Board has crafted a program that fosters a safe and non-judgmental environment, encouraging licensees to engage with important regulatory and public safety messaging. By removing financial barriers, the Board aims to make this educational opportunity accessible, ensuring practitioners stay informed while enhancing public protection.

Analysis of MDS Results for 2023-2024 Renewal Cycles

To better understand the workforce landscape of PTs and PTAs in Louisiana, the Board shared de-identified Minimum Data Set (MDS) survey results with researchers from Franciscan Missionaries of Our Lady University's (Fran U) DPT program.

Using AI-driven analysis, Dr. Phil Page and Dr. Kirk Nelson examined workforce trends, producing a report that highlighted key findings—most notably that PTs and PTAs are concentrated in areas near academic programs. Two poster presentations were presented at the APTA-LA Statewide Conference and then donated to the Louisiana Physical Therapy Board where they will be kept on display at the board office.

Welcome Home Act

Following the passage of the Welcome Home Act in 2024, the Board reviewed current licensure requirements and proposed administrative and regulatory updates to align with the new law. While the Board's existing standards were already in strong compliance with the Act, staff identified additional areas for improvement to better support applicants.

Pre-Application Determination Initiative

In response to Act 486 (2022), which allows individuals to request a pre-licensure eligibility determination based on past convictions, the Board developed an online form for prospective applicants.

Recognizing the potential impact on individuals already enrolled in physical therapy programs, the Board took proactive steps to inform Louisiana's academic institutions about this law—ensuring students can assess their eligibility before investing in education and training.

Strategic Plan

The Board's Strategic Plan is a three-year initiative effective from January 1, 2024, through the end of 2026. The plan is structured around four key focus areas:

- Organizational Effectiveness
- Licensure
- Enforcement
- Education and Outreach

Each goal has been further divided into actionable sub-goals and assigned to the Board's standing committees:

- Continuing Education
- Discipline
- Practice Act
- Operations & Outreach
- Website
